



An Open Letter from Jeremy Thrush '06
USA Men's Basketball Team for the US Team to the 21st Summer Deaflympics

Dear Susquehanna Township Alumni and Friends,

This letter is to introduce you to the US Team, which will be competing in the upcoming 21st Summer Deaflympics September 5-15 in Taipei, Taiwan. The Summer Deaflympics are expected to attract over 2.500 athletes from 67 nations to engage in international competition in 20 sports. In total, the 21st Summer Deaflympics in Taiwan expected to host 20,000 people to witness this world-class event for deaf and hard of hearing athletes.



Each athlete on Team USA will need to raise \$4,500, which includes uniforms, airfare, room and board in Taipei, transportation, registrations fees and expenses while in Taiwan for one month. I am hoping that you will share a contribution to help defray my costs. A partnership with the US Team will enable you to achieve international brand recognition and

enhance your commitment in supporting the deaf and hard of hearing.

It is a great honor for me to represent the United Sates Deaf Sports Federation as we train to make the USA Women's and Men's teams #1 in Taipei. This privilege is given only to athletes who have played internationally. In 2007, I played on the USA Men's Basketball Team in the PAN AM Games in Valencia, Venezuela. Together, our team brought home a Silver Medal. Now that I have been chosen to play in the Deaflympics, our ultimate goal is to bring home the Gold Medal and represent our country to the best of our abilities.




MEMORIAL GARDENS at Veterans Park
